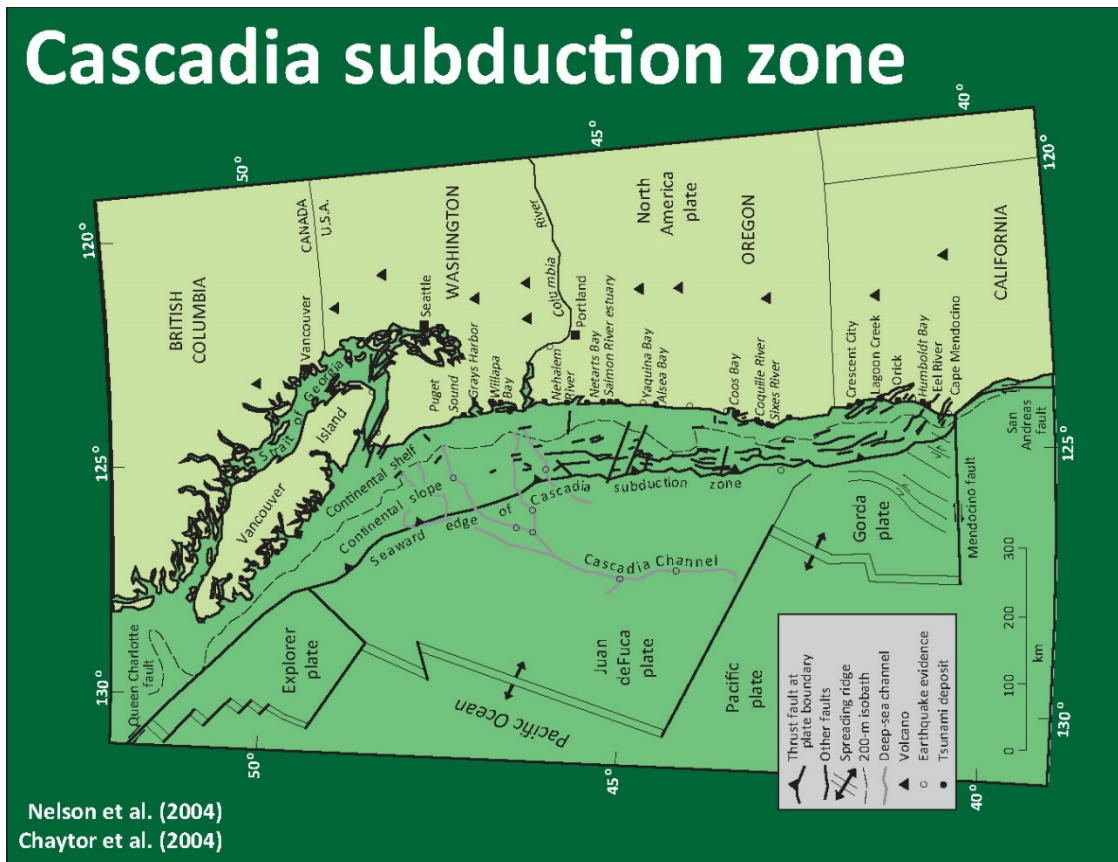


Cascadia subduction zone Earthquake and Tsunami Hazards, along with some sea level observations

The Cascadia subduction zone (CSZ) is a convergent plate boundary fault system located offshore of northern California, Oregon, Washington, and British Columbia. The oceanic Explorer, Juan de Fuca, and Gorda plates subduct eastwards beneath the continental North America plate. Dr. Jason "Jay" R.
